

# 10 STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TODAY

Take charge of your health, wellness, and success.  
Here are 10 steps that can move you closer to your goals – today.

- Don't be afraid to share what you know and how you feel with your audience. You never know how many people out there can use your insights to help change their lives.
- Determine who your audience truly is and what their pains are so that you can provide help or solutions to their problems. They will listen intently when they relate to what you say.
- Focus more on what your audience wants to learn than what you want to say. In the end, what matters is giving the audience what they are looking for so that your keynote becomes memorable.
- Embrace your story and the journey to becoming who you are. This will play a huge part in creating your keynote because people tend to pay more attention when they sense familiarity with what you've been through.
- Film the audience whenever you speak on stage so that you can use it later on to review your performance and analyze the audience's reactions.
- Make sure that you get your audience's full attention on the first five minutes of your speech. This is the most crucial part of the talk because it will determine whether the audience will be engaged or not.
- Talk to your audience as if you're taking them somewhere where they can see what you see, hear what you hear, and feel what you feel. Using this technique helps them connect with you on an emotional level.
- Summarize the content of your keynote at the beginning. This will give your audience an insight into what they can look forward to, and it will also make them feel that your speech is not too long.
- Mingle with your audience after your presentation. Aside from being an excellent way to network, you can also get feedback on how you did.
